We were particularly saddened to hear of the recent passing of Tom Clough, who will be known to so many in his role as a Master at Blundell's from 1958 – 1971, Housemaster of Petergate between 1963 and 1971, Governor, Chairman of the OB Committee, and Chairman of the Chapel Trustees, and himself a former Blundellian in Old House (42-47). Tom was a most generous devotee of Blundell's in all aspects of involvements, and as a founder member of the 1604 Society. He will be very much missed.

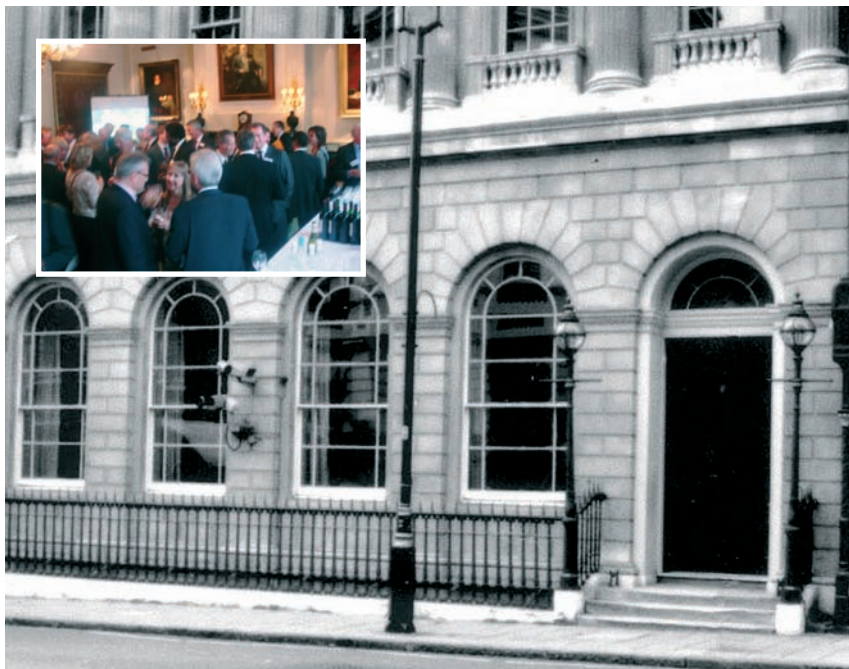
OVERSEAS SUPPORT

London Dinner Friday 4th November - Carlton Club

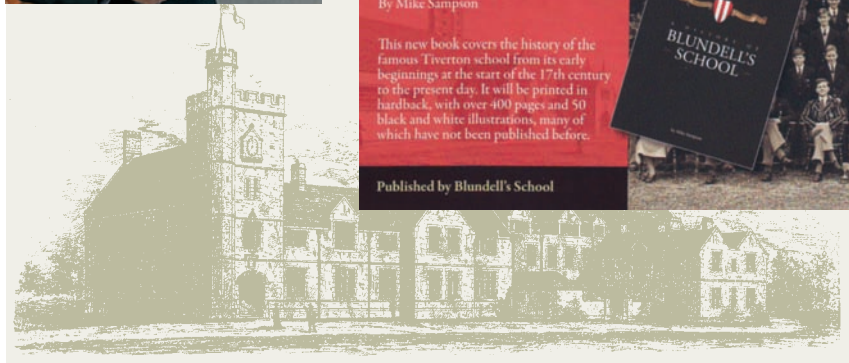
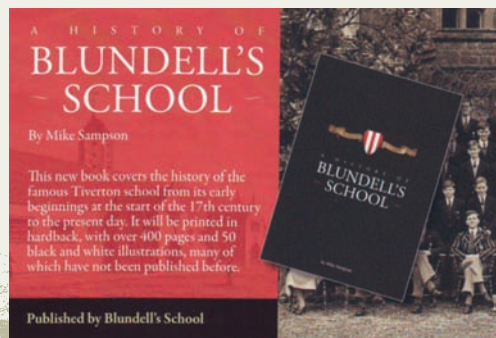

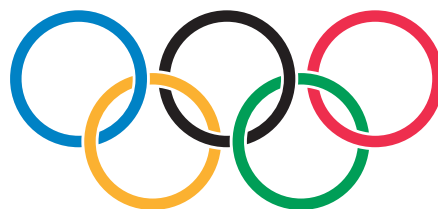
Sidney Sussex Dinner Friday 2nd September - Cambridge
